Location of Field Trip:	Western Utah from the Eureka area to areas around Delta, Utah
Limitation on Number of Participants or Other Issues:	No limitations on numbers have been established for this trip.
Brief Description of Field Trip:	This is a collecting field trip that will focus on areas generally south and west of Salt Lake City including possibly the Eureka, Utah mining area and areas near Delta, Utah. Basically it will mean three continuous days in the field.
Are there any Special Costs such as Admission Charge or Charge for Transportation on a Bus:	Transportation, lodging and food are the responsibility of each individual participating on the trip. Collecting at the pay to dig trilobite quarry (U-Dig Fossils) is \$70 per day for an adult and \$42 per day for ages 7-16. Children 6 and under are free when accompanied by a paying adult. No other special charges are anticipated. We will spend Sunday, Monday and Tuesday (unless some plan to leave the area earlier) night in Delta, Utah
Collectible Materials, if any: NOTE: SPECIFY IF COLLECTING CANNOT BE DONE	Sunstones, topaz, and trilobites are the main focus of the trip, but other minerals will be present in some of the areas.
Est. Time of Return to Original Meeting Place:	We will not return to the original meeting place. After collecting on Tuesday we will return to Delta, Utah where participants can either spend the night or start driving back home.
Vehicle Requirements, if any:	A high clearance 4 wheel drive vehicle is recommended because of dirt roads and back country terrain.
Physical Limitation Concerns, Including Accessibility to Handicapped Individuals:	Although we will not be at major elevation, it could be extremely hot. The terrain may be rough or difficult for walking. Not recommended for those in wheel chairs.
Equipment or Tools Recommended or Required:	We will be doing a variety of collecting from surface collecting to digging to splitting shale. You should bring tools appropriate for all of these activities as well as containers and wrapping materials.
Availability of Water and Sanitary Facilities:	Virtually none. Bring plenty of water and food. There are no sanitary facilities available at all areas except the pay to dig area (out house).
Additional Comments:	Remember we will be in the dessert. It will be cool in the morning and probably hot before mid-day. Hat, sunscreen and layered clothing recommended. Don't forget the sunscreen and lip protection. Sun glasses may be appropriate at times. Note: Rattlesnakes are a potential problem in some of the collecting areas. Please be careful.
